



## Kusini Serengeti

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We've always been drawn to the wild edges – those forgotten corners where Nomad began. Kusini Serengeti is a return to that spirit: light-footed, small-scale, and deeply rooted in the wilderness.

### **1. OFF THE TOURIST TRAIL, A HAVEN FOR THE CURIOUS TRAVELLER**

Kusini is tucked away in the southern Serengeti, far from the usual routes. It's a place for those who prefer to explore quietly, away from the crowds. Here, the landscape feels untouched, and the wildlife encounters are often private and profound. It's a haven for travellers who want to dig a little deeper, to experience the Serengeti as it once was – wild and remote.

It's a chance to experience the Serengeti without the noise – just you, the wildlife, and the vast open spaces. For many, it's the kind of safari they didn't know they were looking for.

### **4. THE LINK IN A WONDERFUL NORTHERN TANZANIA JOURNEY**

Kusini fits naturally into a journey through Northern Tanzania. It's the perfect stop between the southern wilderness and the drama of the northern Serengeti. For those travelling through the region, it offers a rhythm to the journey – a pause that feels both remote and rewarding.

### **5. CATS AND RESIDENT GAME**

Kusini is known for its big cats. Lions, leopards, and cheetahs are regulars here, drawn by the healthy populations of resident game. Even outside the migration season, the wildlife is rich and varied. It's a place where predators thrive, and sightings are often as thrilling as they are frequent.

### **6. MIGRATION OPPORTUNITY DURING GREEN SEASON**

When the rains arrive and the plains turn green, Kusini can become an exciting gateway to the migration. The herds return to the southern Serengeti during the early part of the year for the calving season and can sometimes be found in the woodlands around camp or close by in the area. It's worth noting however, that there are times when the migration is out of reach, but then the Kusini area always delivers. It's a total safari location in itself, one that allows us to provide an incredible safari experience that can include a variety of resident game, birds, rock kopjes to explore, riverine woodlands and the opportunity for walking or driving through these beautiful landscapes.
