# The Safari Collection: Siruai Mobile Camp

KENYA

## GENERAL INFORMATION

CLASSIFICATION	<b>CLASSIC:</b> 1 camp. Annual closure: 16 Jan – 31 May & 16 Oct – 14 Dec. Privately owned.
LAND RELATIONSHIP	The camp is located in the privately owned and managed, 43,000-acre Suyian Ranch.
OVERVIEW	Siruai Mobile Camp operates on exclusive use only, allowing guests to explore Laikipia independently and freely. Perched on a rocky ridgeline, the camp overlooks the Ewaso Narok River valley and the Laikipia Plateau, with views of Mount Kenya beyond. Most definitely off the beaten safari track, Siruai immerses you in a lesser known, wild pocket of Kenya and the incredible scenery of northwest Laikipia.
IMPACT OF YOUR STAY	LOW   MEDIUM   <b>HIGH</b>   VERY HIGH The Safari Collection prioritizes responsible tourism, aiming to minimize environmental impact while sharing East Africa's natural wonders. Through the Footprint Trust, The Safari Collection supports a diverse range of conservation, health and education projects across Kenya which benefit the wildlife, wilderness and local communities. Each guests' stay contributes to their efforts through the Suyian Conservation Fee.
ACCESS	Wilson Airport (WIL) - Daily scheduled flights to Loisaba Airstrip, plus a 45-minute game drive to camp. Private charters to the Suyian Airstrip, which is 10 minutes from camp.
CAMP	7 tents on exclusive use only. Base camp rate. Minimum 3-night stay.
CHILDREN	All ages are welcome. The camp is not fenced and is surrounded by wilderness and rocky ground, so parents need to be watchful of their children.
HEALTH	Low risk malaria area – seek advice from your healthcare professional. Full medical support available. Proof of yellow fever vaccination is required upon arrival in Kenya.

SECURITY	Unfenced, 24-hr security.
MAKE AN IMPACT	A stay at Siruai contributes to the various conservation efforts in the Suyian region.
GYM / KEEP FIT	Through daily activities.
SPA	No.
FOOD & WINE	Fully inclusive: all meals & drinks. Yes Halaal / No Kosher.
OTHER FACILITIES	Fire pit under the stars, bucket shower and flush toilets, wild pool and waterfall.
ACTIVITIES	Daily game drives, walking safaris, bush dining, hiking, waterfall swimming, kayaking, tubing.

## WEATHER

*Located on a plateau and at a higher elevation, Siruai experiences a cooler climate with sunny days but cold evenings and mornings. However, as it is based close to the equator, there is little variation in weather throughout the year.*

### JANUARY – MARCH

9 - 22 °C | 48 - 72 °F

Warmer temperatures with little chance of rain. The camp is usually closed at this time of year but can be opened if requested.

### APRIL – JUNE

11 - 20 °C | 52 - 68 °F

The camp reopens after the long rains end in May. Visit the wild swimming pool and kayak along the base of a waterfall.

### JULY – SEPTEMBER

10 - 20 °C | 50 - 68 °F

Chilly mornings and evenings but lovely warm days. The drier season gives way to perfect conditions to get out and explore.

### OCTOBER – DECEMBER

10 - 21 °C | 50 - 70 °F

The camp closes mid-Oct before the short rains begin.

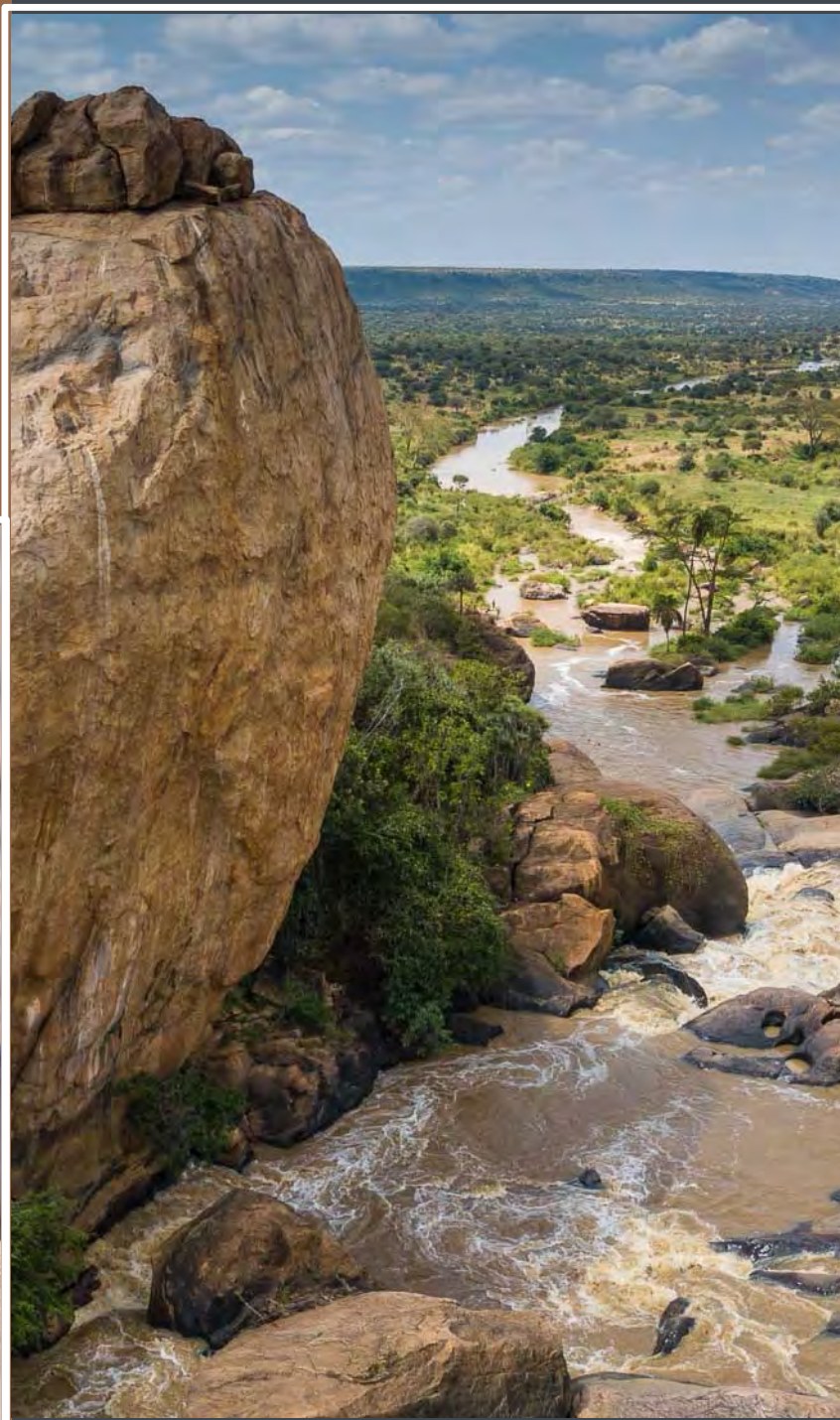






## ACTIVITIES & EXPERIENCES

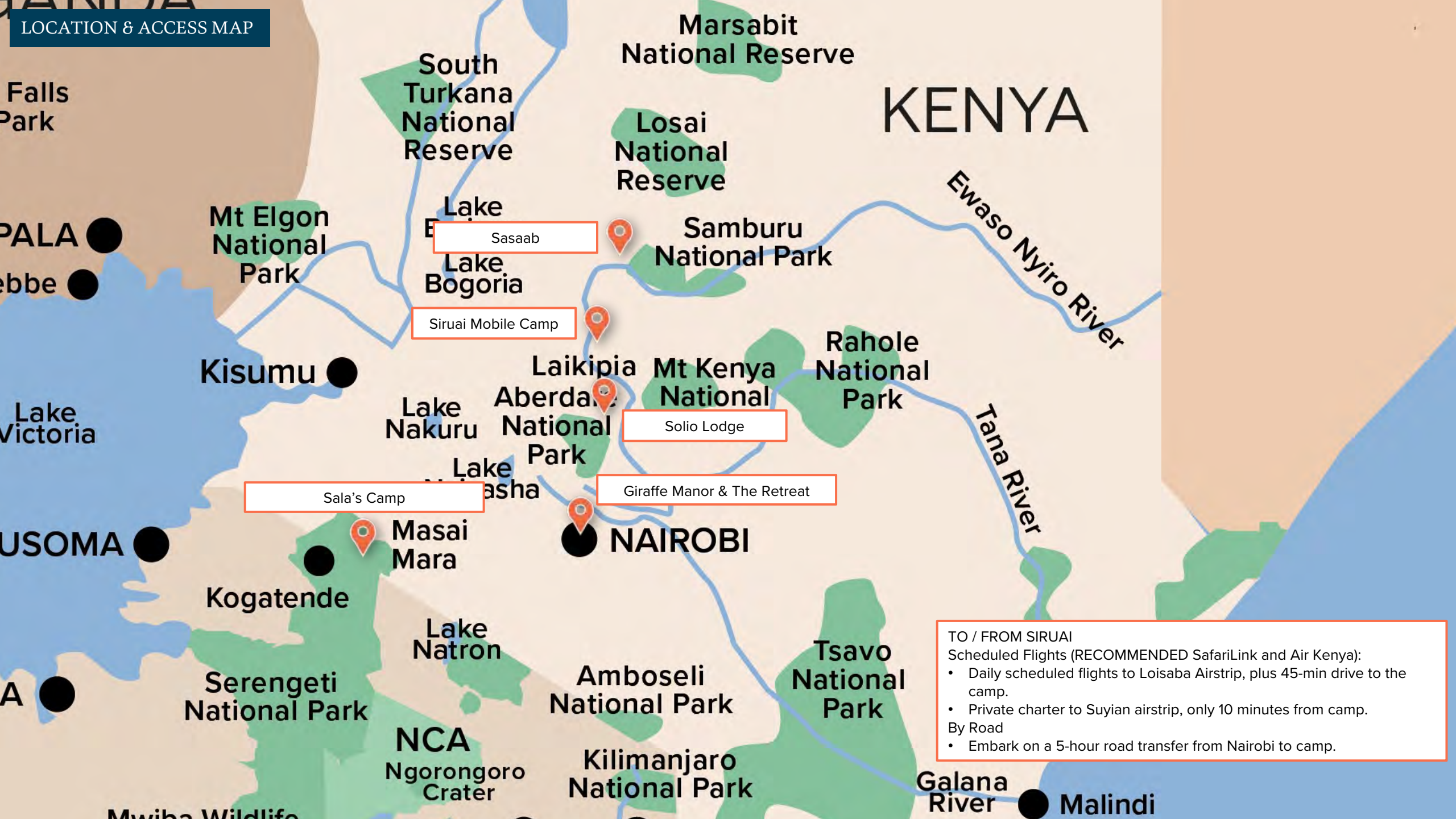
GAME DRIVES	Morning, afternoon, evening, or full day drives.

Scheduled Flights (RECOMMENDED SafariLink and Air Kenya):

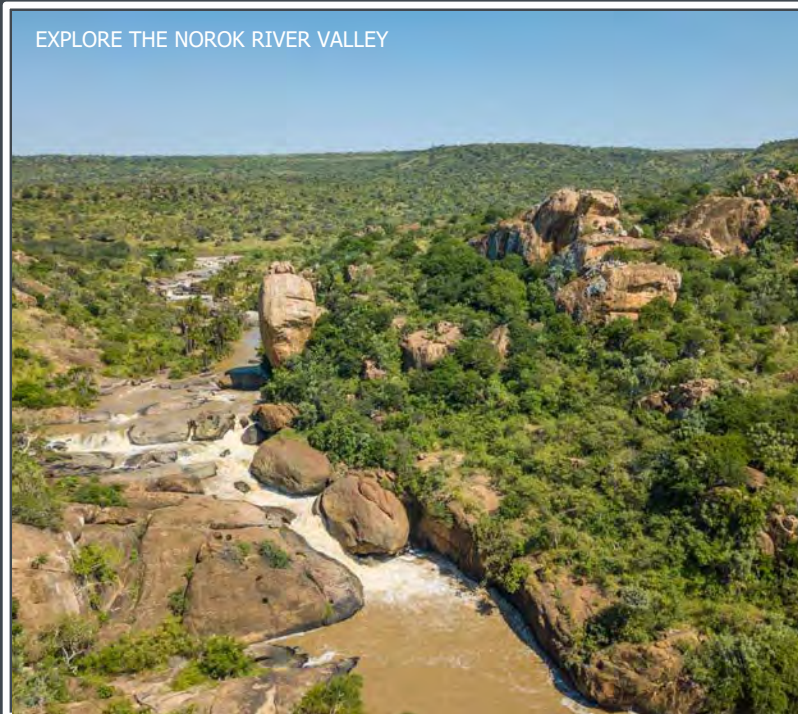
- Daily scheduled flights to Loisaba Airstrip, plus 45-min drive to the camp.
