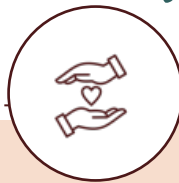
Every cent of the levy goes towards the projects and initiatives outlined below and makes a lasting difference in the eco-system as well as supporting the well-being of the region.

Local community support

We currently employ 60 staff members from our direct communities. Each staff member is the primary bread winner and in turn, supports 10 people on average per family. As a result, we have direct impact on the lives of over 650 people in our communities.



Xunavelela NGO

Established by Tanda Tula's Smiling and Harry Ubisi, the NGO transforms Hluvukani's poverty and HIV challenges through sports, communal gardens, and families in need.



SME development

We are one of the founding members of a consortium of businesses and lodges within the Greater Kruger region who are focused on assisting local community SMEs to provide their goods & services into the supply chain of the Greater Kruger wildlife economy.



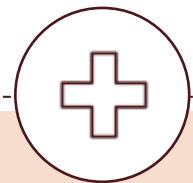
Foundation scholarships

We support Hlokomela with providing funds for their HIV treatment program as well as directly supporting their local clinic in the region which all of our staff have free access to for general health care requirements.



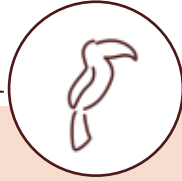

Fire management

We work diligently to control fires in the reserve, preventing uncontrolled blazes that could damage the habitat and endanger wildlife.



Ground hornbill research

Using research to create a better understanding of the breeding ecology and home range use of this cooperative breeding species.



Red-listed trees

We take special care to safeguard endangered tree species, preserving their existence in the ecosystem.



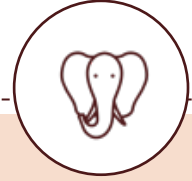
Erosion

Preventing soil erosion is essential to maintaining the integrity of the land and its ability to sustain life.



Alien plant control

Invasive plants pose a real threat to native flora. We engage in efforts to control and eradicate them, promoting biodiversity and ecological stability.



Elephant research

The study of elephants within the TPNR & Greater Kruger Region ensures their survival and promotes harmony with humans.



Selective Bush Clearing

Carefully removing targeted encroaching plant species to promote healthier growth of remaining vegetation, mitigate fire risks and enhance wildlife habitats.



Timbavati Leopard Project

The leopard is listed as "near threatened" on the IUCN Redlist. The Timbavati Leopard Project, through Panthera, aims to address the threats to leopards as part of a comprehensive management strategy.



Soil stewardship

Special attention is given to rehabilitating areas like seep lines, which are crucial to the health of the ecosystem.
